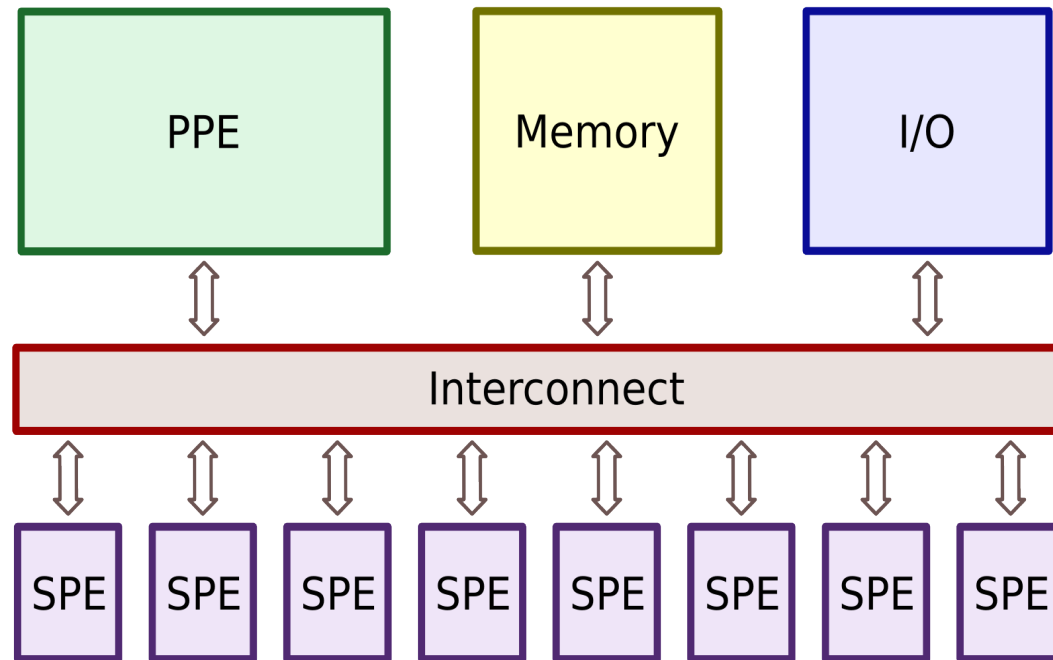


Linux on the PS3 - Overview

- **PS3 Hardware configuration**
 - ▶ *CELL Chip w/six available SPEs*
 - ▶ *256MB Rambus main memory*
- **Firmware support for “OtherOS”**
 - ▶ *Designed to support other operating systems from the outset*
 - ▶ *Hypervisor based environment*
 - All HW access abstracted including 2D (only) frame buffer
- **High resolution (720 lines+) requires HDCP/HDMI**
 - ▶ *Means a new monitor for many users*
 - ▶ *Remote access or composite video are alternatives*
- **From Linux perspective, looks like any other LinuxPPC64 system**
 - ▶ *Additional kernel interfaces and libraries to support SPEs*
 - ▶ *Recent generic PPC32 or PPC64 kernels work fine*
 - Sound broken on latest kernels - temporarily...



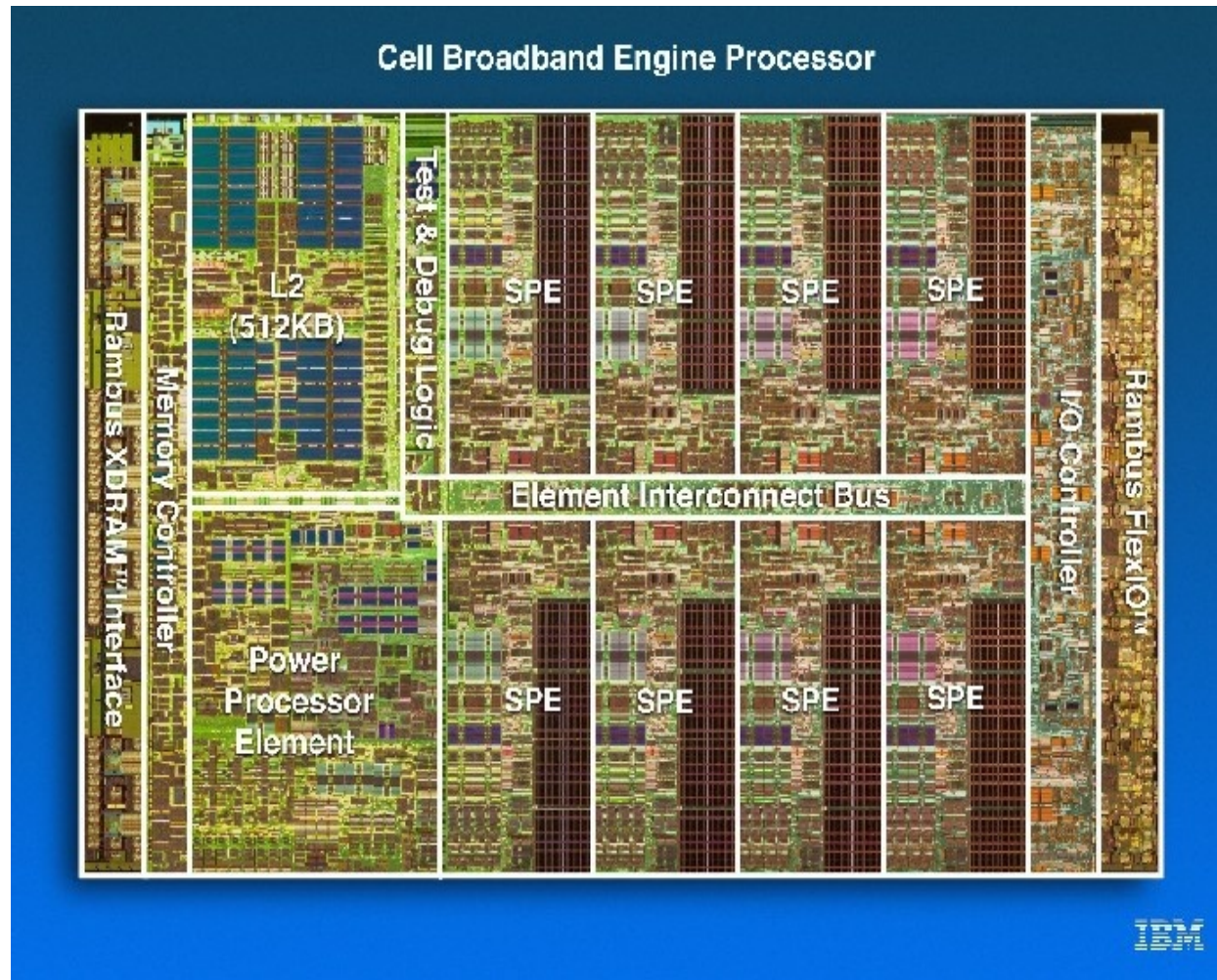
The Cell Broadband Engine



- **PPE – 64 Bit PowerPC core**
 - ▶ 3.2GHz, 2 Way SMT, 512kB L2
- **SPE – SIMD Engines**
 - ▶ 128 GPRs, 128 bit wide / 4 x single precision float
 - ▶ 256kB local store

Linux on the PS3 – Distro Support

- **Yellow Dog Linux (YDL) (Terrasoft Solutions)**
 - ▶ *Official support for PS3 through formal tie-in with Sony*
 - ▶ *Install DVD available*
 - Support included if purchased
 - ▶ *PS3s with YDL pre-installed available through their website*
- **Gentoo**
 - ▶ *First community distro with install support*
 - ▶ *LiveCD and InstallCD images available*
- **Debian**
 - ▶ *LiveCD image available*
 - ▶ *Installer in the works*



Linux on the PS3 – Distro Support

■ **Ubuntu**

- ▶ *PowerPC Edgy & Feisty releases can be bootstrapped and will run normally*
 - Test iso's now available for direct install
 - psubuntu.com is a good reference

■ **Fedora**

- ▶ *Latest release can be installed by using separate install CD along with regular FC PPC ISO*
- ▶ *Direct install CD in the works*

■ **petitboot**

- ▶ *Graphical bootloader based on kboot*
- ▶ *Allows user-friendly selection of which OS to boot*

Linux on the PS3 – User Experience

- **Hey, it's just like a computer!**
- **200MB free memory is easy to exceed**
 - ▶ *Openoffice + Firefox will give swap space a workout*
- **PPU only performance is modest**
 - ▶ *Not unique to PS3*



Linux on the PS3 – Supported Apps

- **All the usual applications work**
 - ▶ *Open Office, Firefox, Thunderbird etc. etc.*
 - Lack of PPC Flash plugin a nuisance
- **Real win will be when apps are ported to use SPEs**
 - ▶ *mplayer*
 - ▶ *speex/Asterisk*
 - ▶ *gnuradio*
 - Porting work underway in ham community
 - ▶ *Second Life client*
 - ▶ *etc...*



Linux on the PS3 – Community Buzz

- **Gentoo**

- ▶ *Saw a 3x increase in visitors to IRC channel on PS3 release*

- **linux.conf.au 2006**

- ▶ *In conjunction with Terrasoft did various demos of the PS3*
 - Lots of interest from general public and conference attendees alike
 - “See Mum, it's a computer as well, you should buy me one!”

- **Programming Competitions**

- ▶ *Terrasoft/HPC Consortium Hackfests*
 - ▶ *IBM University Challenges*



Linux on the PS3 – What's not to like ?

- **Lack of OpenGL support may limit applications**
 - ▶ *Possible that community will create SPE based software GL*
- **Small memory footprint**
 - ▶ *Ok for home, but harder for “serious” developers*
- **Need for HDMI/HDCP compatible monitor**
 - ▶ *Nuisance if you've already got an expensive monitor!*



Linux on the PS3 – Where to from here ?

- **Making use of SPEs crucial**
- **Getting hardware to key projects**
- **Find cool uses :)**
- **Huge potential install base**
